Engineering Career Services does not charge any kind of fee. Our office provides free services to students from any department on campus. All Mizzou students are welcome to use our services and attend our career fair. We often work in conjunction with the Nuclear Engineering office to make sure their students know when companies such as Ameren and others will be doing info sessions and interviews. We do charge companies a fee for the career fair, but that is the only fee we charge at this time. I hope you will pass this information along to Ken Dean and communicate with the NRC as well.

The Business Career Services office charges a fee to any student who uses their services (even Business School students) and I wonder if that is the confusion.
